



THE RING HOUSE

The first frame house in the Maple valley was constructed by William L. Ring in 1865, the year that saw the end of the Civil War. Built of nearly all walnut lumber, the house was originally located 2 3/4 miles north of Mapleton. In 1929,

the house was moved to Mapleton and became property of the Women's Civic Club. They retained ownership until 1997, when the property was deeded to the City of Mapleton. A group of volunteers have restored the home and the Ring House formally opened to the public in 2003.

William L. Ring came to northeast Monona County in 1856 and probably lived in a tent or dug out home until he built the frame house. Mr. Ring held several county elected offices in addition to farming and doing construction work and furniture building. The small three-room house offers visitors an opportunity to learn more about the Ring family and early life in Monona County. The house is open on special occasions or by contacting a member of the Ring House Committee.

Museum of American History

The Museum of American History in Mapleton is located on the corner of 7th Street and Ring Street near the City Park. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the museum building was the former Trinity Memorial Episcopal Church. Completed in 1896, the building is an outstanding example of Gothic Revival and Perpanagua architecture.

There are magnificent stained glass windows throughout the building. Now privately owned and operated, the museum highlights important periods in American History with an emphasis on our nation's political history. Political memorabilia dating back to the 1800's is displayed in the museum. Local history is incorporated into displays of our nation's



history. The museum officially opened September 21, 1996 - almost 100 years to the day following its dedication. To arrange a tour of the museum, contact Keith Robinson. Visitors are always welcome.



The City of Mapleton

The population of Mapleton, Iowa as of 2000 is 1,322.

Mapleton has a Mayor-Council form of government, which consists of a Mayor and five council members. Mayor serves 2 year terms and council members are staggered four year terms.

There is a City Clerk and full-time office staff.

The water system consists of a sewage plant with a lagoon system.

Over 90% of Mapleton's streets are hard surfaced. The city crew, which also takes care of the city parks and cemetery, has ample man power and equipment to do a good job.

The municipal electric system is governed under a utility board, which consists of three members appointed for staggered six year terms. Electricity is purchased thru NIPCO (Northwest Iowa Power Cooperative).

In 2003, Mapleton joined in the telecommunications business, offering local and long distance phone service, cable television and dial-up and high speed internet to it's residents.

Emergency Services

Mapleton provides a volunteer ambulance service and an active volunteer fire department. Both services are on call to the area 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Mapleton has a full time Police Department.

Mapleton's Municipal Airport

Constructed in 1966, the airport facilities consist of a 2800 ft. long, 60 ft.



Recreational Activities

The City of Mapleton offers a wide range of recreational activities for all ages.

Our youth summer baseball and softball programs encompass the city and rural community so that all kids have an opportunity to participate. .



From the middle of May until the middle of July the three ball fields at the southwest edge of the city are utilized every day for T-ball to high school age boys' and girls' games and practices.

The swimming pool on the north edge of the city offers a cool dip to beat the summer heat. Both private and public swimming lessons are available not only to Mapleton residents but those in the surrounding areas as well. The pool features a 118 foot water slide.

In the heart of the city is our public park. Here you can find activities such as tennis, basketball and volleyball. There is new modern playground equipment for

the younger kids.

The Willow Vale Golf Course is located on the west edge of our city. To avid golfers of all ages, Willow Vale offers a beautiful nine hole golf course with driving range and newly remodeled club house. Tournaments and league activities are available for men and women.

If you enjoy sightseeing, Ma-

pleton is the "Gateway" to the Loess Hills. Formed approximately 14,000 years ago, the Loess Hills includes Murray Hill (one of the highest peaks), Preparation Canyon State Park (where the early Mormons settled), DeSoto Wildlife Refuge, Whiting Woods, Turin Man Site and many more scenic areas in the hills to explore.
